Minister's Message - Buddha's Compassion



Because our mother gives us many treasures.

What is our treasure?

The true treasure is the happiness we feel in our hearts when we experience love, warmth, and connection. It's not money, jewelry, or fame.

True treasure never fades—it stays in our hearts forever.

Do you remember when your mother held your hand as you learned to walk?

Do you remember when you were sick, and your mother cared for you, and you felt comfort just seeing her face?

Mothers are the ones who first teach us compassion. Now that we are older, we can truly understand and appreciate the deep kindness and love of a mother.

This understanding—this compassion—is our real treasure.

In Buddhism, we are taught that relationships and connections are among the greatest treasures.

I'd like to share a story about "Engi," which means connection or karmic relationship:

One day, a grandmother and her grandchild went to the cemetery to offer flowers and incense.

The grandchild said, "Grandma, I'm so glad you were born here. Because you were born here, you met Grandpa, and that's why my mom could be born—and that's why I could be born, too. Thank you, Grandma."

The grandmother was deeply touched. Life hadn't always been easy, but in that moment, she truly felt grateful for having been born when and where she was.

If you heard such heartfelt words from your children or grandchildren, how would you feel?

May is a wonderful month to express your love and appreciation to your mother—to tell her how happy you are that she is your mother.
